This award was established in 2017 to honour the legacy of Marjorie Anderson Lynch. In 1935, Anderson Lynch became the first Indigenous woman to graduate from McMaster University.

During her time at McMaster, she was a member of the Choral Society and performed in various musicals and operettas. She is remembered for her ambition and desire to help others.

While honouring her accomplishment, this award allows McMaster to support the post-secondary aspirations of future generations of Indigenous students. As McMaster is located on the traditional territories of the Mississaugas and Haudenosaunee nations, and within the lands protected by the "Dish With One Spoon" wampum agreement, this award is one of the many ways that McMaster partners with local Indigenous communities.
